

Call for Graduate Scholarship Applications

Purpose: Call for scholarship applications from Taiwanese graduate students

Description: Dr. Pei-Ying Lin, Associate professor in the Department of Educational Psychology and Special Education at the University of Saskatchewan is seeking one Taiwanese graduate student (Master's or PhD; PhD is preferred) who can analyze fNIRS data (functional near-infrared spectroscopy). The awardee will come to Canada for the project for six months and is still enrolled at the home university in Taiwan. The student can arrive between the summer and winter semesters (i.e., August 2024 to January 2025).

Duties: The student will co-write a short scholarship application with Dr. Lin. The awardee will then assist Dr. Lin with analyzing fNIRS data used to measure the cognitive skills of children with disabilities.

Remuneration: This short-term exchange program will take six months (scholarship value at \$12,700 CAD). In addition, Dr. Lin will also hire this student as her RA if the university policy allows it after the completion of the scholarship.

Qualifications: The successful candidate will be a graduate student with the skillset to understand and analyze the fNIRS data individually and independently.

Closing Date: Applications will be accepted until January 15, 2024; applicants are strongly encouraged to apply ASAP. Only candidates that are interviewed will be notified.
